Re: 2025 National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference

The 2025 National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference will be held at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center in Louisville, KY, **November 19-20**. **Please note that a block of rooms has been reserved at the Crowne Plaza Louisville Airport**. You can make room reservations by calling the hotel directly at **866-888-0620** and mention that you are making room reservations for the National 4-H poultry and egg conference. You can also make reservations on-line by clicking the link here: https://book.passkey.com/event/51100808/owner/2812/home Information on the Conference and general rules are found at the conference website. All noncontestants including State Specialists and contestants need to be registered prior to the conference.

State 4-H leader must sign off on participants from each state. The form will be emailed directly to 4-H state leaders for each state that has participants attending

The registration information for <u>all attendees</u> is on-line. Please go to the conference website at https://national4hpoultry.ca.uky.edu/ for registration information and link to registration (only available in August 2025). Once on the conference website, click on the Conference Information tab, then click on Conference Registration. This will take you to a page that will show you the link to register. Once you click on that registration link, you can fill in your information and submit your registrations. Please note that an additional registration form is needed for the Egg Chef Challenge Contest. You may pay the registration fee by credit card, debit card, or send in a personal check. You must submit an online registration for each person attending, contestant or non-contestant, although new this year you only have to pay once for everyone if you are using a credit or debit card (preferred method).

A total of three 4-Hers who have attended the conference in the past and competed in any event in the last five years, can serve as Ambassadors to the Specialist Committee. Therefore, there is registration information on the on-line site and each state is allowed to nominate an individual of which a total of three individuals will be selected to serve as Ambassadors to the Specialist Committee. In the nomination, indicate which contests the contestant has previously participated in.

If a contestant, coach, or family member from your state has a disability and desire any assistance, devices, services, or other accommodations such as special dietary restrictions or needs, please contact Dr. Ken Koelkebeck by October 21 at (217) 244-0195; kkoelkeb@illinois.edu during the business hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. central time to discuss accommodations.

Everyone coming to the contest (contestant and non-contestant) <u>must</u> fill in their registration information. Complete instructions are found on the conference registration link on the website.

The Web page for this conference includes the general rules of each contest as well as other general conference information, such as the: Competition History, Schedule of Events, Maps to the Contest, Career Workshop, and the entry information link.

As in previous years, there will be a Poultry Career Opportunities Workshop that will be held at the Crowne Plaza Louisville Airport on Wednesday, November 19, from 8:00 am to 10:30 a.m., with speakers from the 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. hour. Please take note of the workshop program on page 10 in the information packet and plan on attending this program on Wednesday morning. There are two tours of the Louisville area on Wednesday. Please plan on going on one of the tours. Tour 1 is for people who don't attend the career workshop and Tour 2 is for those who do attend the career workshop.

Other activities will include a Get Acquainted Party on Wednesday evening and the Awards Banquet on Thursday. Please see the Schedule of Events on pages 11-13 of the information packet for all scheduled activities.

For the Get Acquainted Party and the Banquet, dietary considerations are the responsibility of the participant. If special meals are required, please indicate so at the time of registration.

Please remember that the **registration deadline** for the contests is **October 12 at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time** and for the Crowne Plaza Louisville Airport is **October 19**. We have a block of rooms reserved so it is important to secure the rooms early and prior to the deadline. When you call in your room reservations, mention that you are with the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference. [If you plan to arrive after 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 18, you will need to provide your credit card number to hold for late arrival.]

IMPORTANT - there is an activities fee for each person registered for the conference, which includes all contestants and non-contestants.

\$50 for each contestant (regardless of number of contests participating in)

\$50 for each non-contestant adult


\$25 for each non-contestant youth (ages 0-12)

\$10 for anyone including non-contestant youth (ages 0-12) participating in a tour. (A tour *may not* be added after the registration deadline). This is because of logistics.

\$18 for anyone wanting to purchase a T-shirt. When ready, the design for the T-shirt will be on the Facebook page, which is: "National 4-H poultry and egg conference".

Please submit your credit card or debit card information at the time of registration. All registrations must be submitted online no later than October 14 at 11:59 PM Eastern Time. No late registration will be accepted.

Online registration will be through the NAILE website (https://naileec.fairwire.com/). On the landing page, DO NOT SAY YOU ARE A TEAM. SO, LEAVE THAT AS THE DEFAULT NO. You are registering as individuals and not as a 'team'. If you say yes to team, you will have re-enter all your information because no actual contestants have been registered. This is for other 4-H events being held at NAILE and registering at the same time. Click on 'Registration' on the timeline and create an account. This is our first time using the NAILE website for registration for the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference. So, select 'I am a new exhibitor or have yet to register this year' even if you attended the Poultry and Egg Conference last year. If you need to register multiple individuals, select the Quick Group link in the blue box labeled tip.



Important - in order to plan for the number of people attending the poultry careers workshop, tours 1 or 2, get acquainted party and awards banquet, <u>please</u> indicate those activities when you complete your on-line registration. If you do NOT plan on attending, please do NOT select it so that no food is wasted.
